WORDS FROM OUR PASTOR

“Is Corona a Judgment from God?”

How’s that for a provocative title? I’ll spoil the cliff hanger and give you my answer here in the first paragraph. Maybe. As I researched the Bible for “bad things”, I noticed at least five different situations. One of them is judgment, but it isn’t the only scenario. Therefore, to say definitively “Yes it is!” or “No it isn’t!” is not for us to say. Here are five Biblical examples of bad things. Each example below is straight from the Bible.

1. Sometimes bad things happen, and it isn’t because YOU sinned. But God can be magnified in bad times.

As [Jesus] went along, he saw a man blind from birth. 2 His disciples asked him, "Rabbi, who sinned, this man or his parents, that he was born blind?" 3 "Neither this man nor his parents sinned," said Jesus, "but this happened so that the works of God might be displayed in him. (John 9:1-3 NIV)

2. Sometimes bad things happen to regular people. We are all sinners and just because it happened to another person doesn’t mean we don’t deserve it.

Now there were some present at that time who told Jesus about the Galileans whose blood Pilate had mixed with their sacrifices. 2 Jesus answered, "Do you think that these Galileans were worse sinners than all the other Galileans because they suffered this way? 3 I tell you, no! But unless you repent, you too will all perish. 4 Or those eighteen who died when the tower in Siloam fell on them – do you think they were more guilty than all the others living in Jerusa-

lem? 5 I tell you, no! But unless you repent, you too will all perish." (Lk. 13:1-5 NIV)

3. Sometimes bad things happen because of sin. This may seem obvious, but the world doesn’t like the concept of God’s wrath. However, it is unavoidable to read it in the Bible.

"I sent plagues among you as I did to Egypt. I killed your young men with the sword, along with your captured horses. I filled your nostrils with the stench of your camps, yet you have not returned to me," declares the LORD. (Amos 4:10 NIV)

4. Sometimes God intervenes for the godly when bad things are happening. We love it when this happens. And we should pray that God delivers us.

Whoever dwells in the shelter of the Most High will rest in the shadow of the Almighty. 2 I will say of the LORD, "He is my refuge and my fortress, my God, in whom I trust." 3 Surely he will save you from the fowler's snare and from the deadly pestilence. 4 He will cover you with his feathers, and under his wings you will find refuge; His faithfulness will be your shield and rampart. 5 You will not fear the terror of night, nor the arrow that flies by day, 6 nor the pestilence that stalks in the darkness, nor the plague that destroys at midday. 7 A thousand may fall at your side, ten thousand at your right hand, but it will not come near you. (Ps. 91:1-7 NIV)

each other. As our ABF shared, I felt God's presence saying that everything will be okay. This has been NO surprise to God thus I CHOOSE to trust in Him alone.



Easter is coming, and the world just feels strange. So many of the simple dynamics I assumed as certain, have been completely upended. It is the little things that suddenly feel so ominous. Will we find toilet paper when we need it? When will dining out with friends be possible again? How do I prepare my children academically? What if...? What next...? What now...? There are endless questions and very few answers.

Yet, there is one very important answer provided in our memory verse this month from Revelation 1:18, "I am alive for ever and ever!" Our theme in the Early Childhood program for the month of April is "Bloom" and we are learning that Jesus is alive! We will spend time focusing on the death and resurrection of Jesus.



So often my focus is on the resurrection aspect of Easter, but this year the weight of uncertainty the disciples must have experienced has been heavy on my heart. These men knew Jesus. They ate and drank together. Traveled together. Witnessed miracles and preaching. Saw firsthand who Jesus was and what he did. They knew Him, and Jesus did not hide from them that He was leaving soon. Nevertheless, their world was completely rocked when Jesus was arrested and crucified.

They too must have had endless questions and very few answers. Everything must have suddenly felt strange. Felt ominous. What did Jesus' death mean for them as individuals? What kind of men were they really?

In times of turmoil and insecurity, we are given a choice. Do we truly trust and rely on who God says He is, or do we lean on our own understanding? As believers today we have the benefit and gift of God's word in the Bible. We know the ending. We know Jesus is alive! But are we living like we do? Are we teaching our children how to bloom in a world adverse to Christ followers?

We are in the midst of a huge opportunity to deepen our faith and decide how we will live. Thankfully, we know Jesus' death was not the end of the story. The disciples did not disband to never be heard of again. They were transformed through their weaknesses and failures to bring glory to God, and share Jesus with a lost and hurting world. God can transform us too. He enables us to bloom, despite our weaknesses and failures. What a reason to rejoice!

As we approach Easter, I pray we all grow in our understanding of the magnitude of what Jesus endured on our behalf. May we all praise Jesus for He is risen, and know the darkness made the light all the more bright.

So, what do we do in the midst of all this uncertainty? We set our eyes upon Jesus, and we bloom.



5. Sometimes God doesn't intervene when bad things are happening, but He is still good. This is the most difficult scenario. Bad things happen to godly people. Read Hebrews 11:32-39.

³² And what more shall I say? I do not have time to tell about Gideon, Barak, Samson and Jephthah, about David and Samuel and the prophets, ³³ who through faith conquered kingdoms, administered justice, and gained what was promised; who shut the mouths of lions, ³⁴ quenched the fury of the flames, and escaped the edge of the sword; whose weakness was turned to strength; and who became powerful in battle and routed foreign armies. ³⁵ Women received back their dead, raised to life again. There were others who were tortured, refusing to be released so that they might gain an even better resurrection. ³⁶ Some faced jeers and flogging, and even chains and imprisonment. ³⁷ They were put to death by stoning; they were sawed in two; they were killed by the sword. They went about in sheepskins and goatskins, destitute, persecuted and mistreated-- ³⁸ the world was not worthy of them. They wandered in deserts and mountains, living in caves and in holes in the ground. ³⁹ These were all commended for their faith, yet none of them received what had been promised, (Heb. 11:32-39 NIV)

So, how should we respond? One more passage is needed. Look at the book of Daniel and how three men responded to potential bad things. They were about to be tossed into a furnace.

¹⁶ Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego replied to him, "King Nebuchadnezzar, we do not need to defend ourselves before you in this matter. ¹⁷ If we are thrown into the blazing furnace, the God we serve is able to deliver us from it, and he will deliver us from Your Majesty's hand. ¹⁸ But even if he does not, we want you to know, Your Majesty, that we will not serve your gods or worship the image of gold you have set up." (Dan. 3:16-18 NIV)

Is Corona a judgment from God? Maybe. It is at least one of five possible options. No matter what it is, we can all learn and grow in this time by looking up to God, waking up to God and resting in Jesus knowing He's got this!




F O S T E R S I N P A N A M A – B U T T E R F L I E S , H U M M I N G B I R D S A N D F R O G S

During our first month in Catrigandi we saw many undesirable critters. This past week however, we have felt hope and peace as we have enjoyed seeing butterflies in and around the house. One in particular caught my eye, as it is my favorite, and it used to frequently enter our home in Yaviza. I had never seen it in Catrigandi before, even though we have certainly spent more years in that home. It is a bright blue, and when she perches on the wall she is brown on the other side with “owl eyes” to scare away predators, once she even fooled me!

Kalea went to use our out door latrine, the “out house”.....and inside she found a hummingbird flying around.

This week, there have also been toads and small tree frogs watching me...it feels like they see my every move! They stop in their tracks and stare, and so do I.

We have been enjoying the weather....many breezes, and even coolness! The weather and all Gods creation has inspired me and I feel blessed to be in Catrigandi. I reflect on how much we have worked to make a home here. Keeping a house from being “eaten” by the jungle is tricky work. We are blessed with the many neighbors around us that feel like family. I got together with the women and learned how to make tamales. Stewed chicken, sautéed in onions, tomatoes and garlic and wrapped with fresh ground corn that is worked into a dough. The dough wraps up the chicken and sauce and then is boiled inside of banana leaves. It was a lot of work! It took most of the day to prepare, and only a minute to eat up! (happy smile, thumbs up, and happy belly).



After spending the day with these women, I felt very thankful for them. It feels a bit like heaven, having such nice families around in the same community, and though, when I am working and doing at home, I get content, and it feels a bit like work to step out and go visit. Do you know and have a relationship with the neighbors around you? I encourage you to reach out to a neighbor! We like to share food with our neighbors, here it is common to go for a visit and bring a gift of food, and other times, its a gift to just share time together.

FOSTER REPORT

Ironically we have just studied the influenza of 1918 with Kalea's homeschool... a time when many medicines were not even in existence, and basic knowledge of hygiene was not highly practiced. Fast forward to 1932 and we hear from President Franklin Delano Roosevelt, "We have nothing to fear but fear itself"...this seems to be running through my head.

Don't let fear drive you this season. "God gave us his Spirit. And the Spirit doesn't make us weak and fearful. Instead, the Spirit gives us power and love." - 2 Timothy 1:7

Here on the ground in Panama, life has looked pretty much the same up until now. Homeschooling is happening and after a busy month for Alan, most of which included travel to surrounding communities to help with water systems, it is surreal how our freedom to move and travel seems to be coming to a halt. The government is becoming more proactive and seeming to follow step with U.S. policy. On that note, pray with us, if we are promoting and serving communities with clean water, in crisis, we always have humanitarians that are serving others to meet their health needs. We struggle with this now, what is the right thing to do? Do we self isolate at home, or do we heed to the call? Just this morning, Alan received his 3rd communication from a village, an elder, pleading for him to come. They say they are not scared of the virus, but are eager for water.

So I tell you, use social media and news wisely. The statistics are real, far more people die in car crashes and water borne illnesses each day. Not to belittle the seriousness of what is going on in the world right now. And we trust this will be an opportunity for us to educate more effectively on hygiene, even as we continue to take precautions.

And Jesus told his disciples, "I leave my peace with you. I give my peace to you. I do not give it to you as the world does. Do not let your hearts be troubled. And do not be afraid." - John 14:27

We are praying for you and your loved ones during this time, for your health and safety. May you feel overwhelmed with His peace.

Alan here... I thought it might be interesting to note that we might be the most socially isolated people you know. That's a plus right now, I think. The minus is that our neighbors and communities here have a very limited knowledge of disease causes and transmission. We've had an indigenous family in our home recently. Although I talked her out of using lemon tree thorns to lance the blisters caused by the mange that her 3 year old was carrying, she had already cooked a football size chunk of termite nest full of live termites on our stove by the time Colleen found her. (Colleen ended up contracting the mange... again... so I get to continue referring to her as my mange-y wife). This liquid our guest proceeded to use to bathe the mange on the child. I dunno. Maybe it has something to it, but I know we shouldn't inject non-sterile objects in our flesh. I'm certain of it. The other neighbor showed up with her child that had a fever yesterday... "But he's fine now! It was probably just his amoebas acting up since the moon is changing phase." That was a new one, even for me and the indigenous family staying with us. Where do you start? If nothing else, all the hype and fear will allow us to be a little bolder in educating folks about health with less chance of offending them.

We just got another water system online in the village of La Reserva. It was such a blessing to have visitors come down and share in the work, the relationship, and the joy of serving in and through the church there.



M U L T I P L Y – V I S I O N F O R M I S S I O N

Each mission context has its own challenges and spiritual strongholds opposing the Gospel. During a recent training event we were hosting in North Africa, we focused on the impact of the dhimma, which was the contract that Muslim governments imposed on Christians and Jews when they conquered their lands. The dhimma prohibited witness and required a 10% tax each year in exchange for life. The spiritual impact of the dhimma is fear and silence among Christians today. In response, Christians cursed the “Ishmaelites” and used a poor translation of Genesis 15:23 to justify their attitude. It’s not hard to see how this would limit the Church in their witness to Muslim neighbors.

We engage spiritual strongholds with spiritual weapons, namely the finished work of Christ on the cross. A Christian leader from a Muslim background who was present at the training event stood up and confessed the sins of his people, the Ishmaelites. He asked for forgiveness from the Christians who represented the historic Church in the region that lived under Muslim rule for 1400 years. A leader from the historic Christian community then stood up and spoke words of forgiveness. On behalf of the Church in this region, he not only confessed their resentment and mistrust toward the Muslims but also their apathy in accepting restrictions on Gospel witness. He prayed that his people would be released from fear, and that they would welcome their new brothers and sisters in Christ from Muslim background. Thankfully, this is something that is happening more and more throughout this region and around the world.

What significant spiritual strongholds are holding back our witness in the mission context in which we are living? How can the Church respond? What is Jesus inviting us to do?


